Representative Mary Littleton is the state representative for Tennessee House District 78, which includes Cheatham and part of Dickson counties. Representative Littleton currently serves as the chair of the Children and Family Affairs Subcommittee, where she has been a leader consistently

championing the rights of children and families across the state. Representative Littleton has been a longstanding advocate for the most vulnerable children, especially those who are neglected and abused, and she has an extensive history of passing critical legislation protecting these children and preventing further abuse. Representative Littleton serves on the 23rd Judicial District Child Advocacy Board, Human Trafficking Advisory Council, and as the Second Look Commission co-chair. In her free time, Representative Littleton enjoys spending time with her family, including her children and grandchildren.

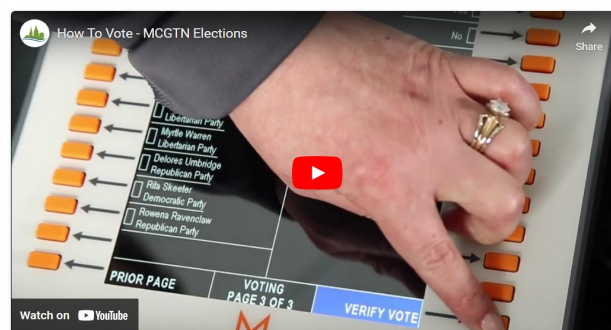
