Dr. Worthington is director of schools for the Clarksville-Montgomery County School System He will discuss the Common-Core program with us. Dr. Worthington is a 28-year veteran in the 31,000-student Clarksville-Montgomery County school system. Two years ago, by a unanimous school board vote and what some have described as popular demand from the community, Mr. Worthington, 53, became the Director of Schools (the district's title for superintendent) for the district. A former high school science teacher and principal, Mr. Worthington bolstered the district's STEM focus, spurred by a federal "Race to the Top" grant that he had helped win and piloted the externship program with a small cohort of high school teachers that same summer. We are happy that Dr. Worthington will be speaking to us today.

"The Republican National

Committee (RNC) is the U.S. political committee that provides national leadership for the Republican Party of the United States. It is responsible for developing and promoting the Republican political platform, as well as coordinating fundraising and election strategy."

On August 19, 2014, The RNC approved two anti-common core resolutions and these have been confirmed by the RNC and can be viewed at this link: copy and paste

1) <u>Resolution Concerning Advanced</u> Placement U.S. History (APUSH)

> "The Tennessee Republican Party State Executive Committee

operates as the governing body for the state party. They establish rules and measures that best promote the success of the Republican Party and the broadening of its base. The SEC serves as the TNGOP's state primary board and also establishes policy to guide and direct County Republican Parties. Each member serves as a representative of the TNGOP in their home district (one man and one woman are elected from each State Senate district) and helps to organize and promote Republican activism at the local level."
