

NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR OFFICER ELECTIONS TO BE HELD IN NOVEMBER

According to the MCRWC Bylaws, it is now time, at the September meeting, to **elect a Nominating Committee** of five members and one alternate which will present names for the November election for the office of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer for the next term of 2018-2019.

Members will be asked to nominate names of these five members and an alternate and it is hoped that you will consider serving in this very important role if your name is brought forward to serve on the committee. Upon presentation of all the names brought into nomination, the membership will elect these six committee members. Article VII, Section $5 \dots$ "Election shall be by ballot and a majority of all votes cast shall constitute an election. Where there is one candidate for an office, election may be by voice vote."

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE are to submit one nominee for each office in a report to be announced to the Club Membership the meeting one month (October) prior to the meeting when the elections will be held (November). Article VII, Section 1, Section 2

Following the report of the Nominating Committee, "the floor must be opened for other nominations" and "such other nominees shall have given written consent to serve if elected to the Nominating Committee." Article VII, Section 4

THOSE QUALIFIED TO BE A NOMINEE OF THE COMMITTEE ". . . shall be members in good

standing of this organization and shall be in accord with the objectives, bylaws, and policies of this organization, the Republican Party and its Platform." Article VII, Section 3

CANDIDATES FOR OFFICERS "... seeking office to MCRWC must have voted Republican in four of the four most recent state and or local Republican primary elections. A copy of their voting record must be submitted to the currently serving nominating committee. (Article VII, Section 6) In addition, "Members seeking office to MCRW who have not voted Republican four (4) of the four (4) most recent state and or local Republican primary election can submit in writing the clarification of their record to the currently serving nominating committee for consideration." Article VII, Section 7

Please consider attending this September meeting. Not only is it a very important meeting but a great speaker is scheduled. We are urging everyone who can possibly attend to do so. If you would like to be a member of the nominating committee or an officer, please make every effort to attend this meeting or let Joy Huggins know.

From our Cookbook ... Beans for a Bunch **Joan Niles** Page 50 3 (55-ounce) cans Bush's baked beans, original 1 pound ground chuck, browned 1 pound bacon, browned and crumbled 2 large onions 1 (14-ounce) bottle of Heinz ketchup 3 teaspoons turmeric 3 cups brown sugar

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Place beans, ground chuck, bacon, onions, ketchup and brown sugar in a throw-away roaster (who needs to wash more dishes). Bake for three hours. Cover, then keep warm until needed. Can be divided and frozen for later.



WOMEN IN THE GOP

...CONTINUED FROM LAST MONTH

For more than 150 years, women have been an active and vital force in the Republican Party.

2001 — President George W. Bush appoints several women to key positions in his administration, including Condoleezza Rice, the first female National Security Adviser; Gale Norton, the first female Interior Secretary; and, Ann Veneman, the first female Agriculture Secretary.

Just days before her 105th birthday, Emma Schweer is re-elected tax collector of Crete Township, Ill. Most likely the nation's oldest elected official, Schweer serves more than 35 years in that office before her death in July 2001.

2002 — Congresswoman Deborah Pryce of Ohio is elected chairman of the House Republican Conference, making her the highest-ranking Republican woman ever to serve in the majority party in Congress.

Jennette Bradley is elected lieutenant governor of Ohio, thereby becoming the first African-American Republican woman in the nation to serve in that office.

2004 — President George W. Bush appoints **Dr. Condoleezza Rice** to serve as U.S. Secretary of State, making her the first African-American woman nominated to that position.

Becky Skillman becomes the first woman elected lieutenant governor of Indiana, while Betty Ireland is the first woman elected to serve in West Virginia's executive branch of government. Sarah Steelman is the first Republican woman elected state treasurer in Missouri.

2006 — Michele Bachmann is the first Republican woman elected to Congress from Minnesota. Sarah Palin is the first woman elected governor of Alaska.

This month's candidate featured is **Senator Mae Beavers**. The information provided here was taken from her website at <u>https://</u><u>www.maebeavers.com</u>. You can go to that site to get more information.

Senator Beavers was

elected to the State Senate in 2002 and represents the people of District 17. She has sponsored and passed laws which included legislation to lower the sales tax on food, legislation to protect our constitutional rights to privacy and to keep and bear arms, as well as legislation that enabled Tennesseans to make their own healthcare choices. She has also worked with numerous local leaders from Cannon, Clay, DeKalb, Macon, Smith and Wilson Counties to secure funding and bring road and bridge projects to District 17.

Senator Beavers has also led the fight to strengthen the laws against users and distributors of meth, while also fighting for law-abiding citizens to have access to cold medicine without government interference. She has been a successful advocate for Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), and was called upon by Governor Bill Haslam to sponsor, debate and pass legislation to toughen our state's synthetic drug and DUI laws. Senator Beavers also fights each and every day to keep government small and accountable to those it represents.

Senator has a Bachelor of Science degree from Trevecca Nazarene University. Before retiring, she attended Nashville School of Law and worked as a court reporter and paralegal.

Since being elected to the State Senate, she has taken a leadership role, serving six years as Chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee, two years as First Vice-Chair of the Energy and Natural Resources Committee, and is currently First Vice-Chair of the Transportation Committee and Chair of the Joint Government Operation Committee's Judiciary and Government Subcommittee.

Senator Beavers and her husband of 49 years, Jerry, attend Trevecca Community Church, and are proud parents and grandparents.
