John Fuson began his law enforcement career with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office in March of 1998 as a reserve deputy. He has held various full-time positions with the Sheriff's Office and currently serves as Sheriff of Montgomery County with over 20 years of dedicated service to our citizens.

John's political career began on August 5, 2010 when he was elected to the 7th District of the Montgomery County Commission where he served on seven committees. During his tenure as County Commissioner, John was elected by fellow County Commissioners from across Middle Tennessee, to represent them as Director of the Tennessee County Commissioners Association. second Montgomery County Commissioner to be elected to this position.

John was selected to fill the vacancy in the Office of Sheriff on December 10, 2012 after incumbent Sheriff Norman Lewis lost his battle with cancer. John was preparing to run for Sheriff in the 2014 County General Election prior to his appointment. He subsequently won that election among a field of 4 other candidates with 58% of the vote. He is currently unopposed in the Montgomery County May 1 Primary and will be the GOP candidate in the August general Election.

During his tenure, Sheriff Fuson has successfully and conservatively managed five Multi Million-Dollar budgets, reorganized staff to increase the law enforcement presence on our streets and in our schools, and nearly doubled the case/solve rate for our Criminal Investigations. He has also improved the training program for his staff to ensure their safety and the safety of the public that they serve. Sheriff Fuson has also worked closely with State leaders and has consistently had more State Inmates removed from our local jail than before. This has kept our state inmate population to its lowest in ten years, saving thousands of local tax dollars.

Sheriff Fuson is currently a member of and works closely with the Tennessee Sheriff's Association. He was recently selected by his peers to represent them on the Board of Directors as Vice President for Middle Tennessee. He also serves on the Legislative Committee for the Tennessee Sheriffs Association and continues to work closely with the Tennessee General Assembly and Sheriff's across our state, to toughen laws that directly affect the safety of our citizens.



Community and civic involvement is also very prominent in John's life. He recently completed his 18th year of coaching for the Woodlawn Little League where he has held various positions on the board of directors, up to and including president. John is a member of the National and Tennessee Sheriff's Associations, and a graduate of Leadership Clarksville 2013. He supports our local Volunteer Fire Departments, Big Brothers / Big Sisters, Boys and Girl Scouts of America, Safe House, Crime Stoppers, LEAP, and the Disabled American & Vietnam Veterans Associations.

Sheriff Fuson currently holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Bethel University, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude. He also attended Austin Peay State University where he studied Public Management, Police Science and Administration, and Criminal Justice.

John is a devoted husband of 24 years to Jennifer Rawlings Fuson and father of three children; Holly, Sarah, and Cole Fuson. He enjoys spending what free time he has hay farming, golfing, camping, and spending quality time with his family. John and his family are Christians and members of Blooming Grove Baptist Church in Woodlawn where they reside.

The 110th General Assembly Ashley Elizabeth Graham

Legislative Committee Chair

When you read this, hopefully, the 2nd Session of the 110th General Assembly will have adjourned sine die. Latin for without day, it's the parliamentary term for the end

of a legislative body. The 110th General Assembly dissolved, we await the elections in November and the creation of the 111th General Assembly in January!

Before we get into 2019 – which I'm sure will come much too quickly – I wanted to share with you highlights from this year's recently passed state budget. Constitutionally, passing a budget and funding the state is one of the few required activities for both legislative chambers, but as tradition, the House and the Senate wait until the very last days of Session to pass the budget – and then getting out of town and back home as fast as possible. ©

The 2018 -2019 total state budget of \$37,632,526,800 and includes:

- \$247 million to K-12 education
- -\$119.3 million for higher education
- -a \$50 million increase to the Rainy Day fund for a total of \$850 million (the highest amount ever)
- -an investment of \$80 million to FastTrack Job development
- -a direct investment of \$14.5 million to Rural Development
- and invests \$460 million in our state assets with capital maintenance and construction.

This fiscally sound budget does not grow at a greater rate than the growth of the economy, funds an additional \$30 million for school safety, and contains base budget reductions totaling \$78.6 million.

Tennessee maintains her rate of being one of the best managed states in the Union. This is a strong, conservative budget we can be proud of and champion. As always, let me know if you have any questions and I'll find an answer for you.

Up next month? Legislative races to watch across the state.

Apple Crisp with Orange Juice

Barbara Bush

Page 144

4 cups sliced pared tart apples
1/4 cup orange juice
1 cup sugar
3/4 cup flour, sifted
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
Dash of salt
1/3 cup butter
Ice cream, if desired

Mound apples in a buttered pie plate and pour orange juice over them. In a separate bowl, combine sugar, flour, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt; cut in butter until mixture is crumbly. Sprinkle over the apples. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes or until apples are tender and the topping is crisp. Serve warm with ice cream.


