Stephen will speak to us about "The American Bible Project", which is similar to the 917 Society. He tells the history of the "American Bible" and how the project wants to put one copy of that Bible in every History classroom. The goal is to use it as a history lesson, not religious, but the kids have access to it.

Steve Skelton has previously served as a writer-producer for Dick Clark Productions and more recently as author of The Mayberry Bible Study, the video-based Bible study that uses episodes of the beloved show as modern parables.

An instant national bestseller, this study became one of the fastest-selling video-based Bible studies in the history of its publisher. The breakout success of this study led to increasing requests for more studies and compelled Steve to establish The Entertainment Ministry, which ministers with the belief that many stories which transcend social, racial and cultural barriers do so because they contain spiritual truth for which all people have a God-given hunger.

SAUL ALINSKY – HOW TO CREATE A SOCIAL STATE
 Saul Alinsky was born on 30 January 1909 in Chicago, IL
 Died 12 June 1972 (age 63) Carmel-by-the-sea, CA

1. Healthcare Control:

Controls people and their ability to function and maintain wellness.

2. Poverty:

Increase poverty level high as possible, poor people are easier to control, will not fight back if you are providing everything for them to live.

3. Debt:

Increase debt to an unsustainable level and you are able to increase taxes, this will produce more poverty.

4. Gun Control:

Remove the ability for the people to defend themselves from the government, then you are able to create a police state.

5. Welfare:

Take control of every aspect of their lives, (food, housing, income etc.).

6. Education:

Take control of what people read and listen to and what their children learn in school.

7. Religion:

Remove their belief in God from the government and the schools.

8. Class Warfare:

Divide people into wealthy and poor classes. This causes more discontent and will make it easier to take (tax) the wealthy with the support of the poor.
